#### **Interview with Thomas Bessis**

One of the more distinguished guests of the 40th festival is 21-year-old Thomas Bessis from Paris, France. Thomas represented France 5 times in the European Junior Championship, winning 3r d place in Antalya 2000 (Schools) and in Riccione 2005 (Juniors). He was also a member of the French Junior team winning 4th place in the World Championship in Australia 2005. We talked to him during a break in the Mixed Team event at the opening day of the festival.

### What do you do besides playing bridge?

I study mathematics in Paris. Now in the 4t h year of University.

## Are you going to be a bridge professional?

No, I have no such plans. Maybe later in life. I have played in Estoril (World Championship 2005) with a sponsor but I don't like sponsors. Maybe I can do something else connected with bridge such as creating software.

## Who is your regular partner?

I have been playing together with Julien Gaviard for 8 years. He was always my partner in the Juniors and recently we won 3r d place in the French open team championship and 4t h place in the pairs championship.

# Is he coming to this Festival?

No, unfortunately he couldn't come, so I am playing here with my Israeli friends whom I have met during the Junior championships: Dana Tal, Ron Hoffman, Ron Segev, Eldad Ginossar, Yotam Bar-Yosef. In the

Open Pairs I am playing with Thalia Koren. And today, in the Mixed Teams, I am playing for the Ron Segev team.

## So, none of your French friends has come together with you?

No. My uncle, Alain Levy (member of the world champion French team of the 1990s), who has once trained the Israeli team, was training the Turkish team 2 weeks ago and he had to spend some time together with his family so he can't come here.

## What are your impressions of Israel?

I haven't seen very much of it yet, just arrived this afternoon. But I am going to have some free time to visit Haifa and Jerusalem.

### How do you like the Tel Aviv Festival?

Everything is perfect; and the atmosphere here is more friendly than in French festivals.
